

Moree Race Club Conditions of Entry 20/7/21

1. Moree Race Club has implemented safety measures to mitigate the risk of COVID-19 and to ensure the safety of patrons, staff and the wider community.
2. Moree Race Club reserves the right to remove any patron not complying with COVID-19 safety measures.
3. The safety measures are intended to minimise the risk of contracting Covid-19, but this risk cannot be completely eradicated. Visitors enter Moree Race Club at their own risk.
4. **Patrons are not permitted to attend Moree Race Club events if they:**
 - Exhibit any flu-like symptoms including but not limited to:
 - Runny nose
 - Persistent cough
 - Sore throat
 - Shortness of breath
 - Fever
 - Have been in close contact with a person that has tested positive for COVID-19
 - Are awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test
 - **If you were in the Greater Sydney Area or have been at any of the NSW COVID-19 exposure sites as per NSW Health Orders in the past 14 days**
 - **If you were in a Queensland COVID-19 Exposure Site in the past 14 days**
 - Have returned from international travel and have failed to comply with the government mandated 14 days of hotel quarantine
5. All patrons must provide their contact details via QR code scanning at the entrance to Moree Race Club for contact tracing purposes. Please note that this information will be kept confidential and will be disposed of after 28 days.
6. Should a patron or staff member become unwell, they must immediately notify Moree Race Club staff and then immediately leave the racecourse premises.
7. Should a patron or staff member become unwell, they must immediately notify Moree Race Club staff and then immediately leave the racecourse premises.
8. All patrons are to observe 1.5 meters of physical distancing and comply with all NSW Health requirements.
- All patrons are to undertake the following measures to ensure good personal hygiene:
 - **Mandatory face masks (N95 or surgical) are to be worn by all persons over the age of 12years including Essential Personnel and patrons (where permitted) at race meetings and barrier trials conducted throughout NSW.**
 - Practice good cough and sneeze etiquette
 - Wash hands regularly using the soap provided
 - Avoid touching your face
 - **Any Essential Personnel that reside or have been to the Greater Sydney Area since 12 July 2021 and wish to attend a racecourse or licensed premises (including race meetings, barrier trials or trackwork) in a Regional Area (outside the Greater Sydney Area) must provide Racing NSW Stewards with a negative COVID-19 test, taken within 72 hours prior to attending the racecourse or licensed premises in a Regional Area. Further once such test is taken, Essential Personnel must not leave their place of residence other than for work purposes or absolutely essential purposes only (even if other**

activities would be technically permitted under the reasonable excuses in the NSW Government orders).

- Test results should be sent to steward@racingnsw.com.au
- Essential Personnel intended to travel to a racecourse or licensed premises in a Regional Area should ensure that they have proof of a negative COVID-19 obtained within the previous 72-hours test before they depart the Greater Sydney Area to avoid the risk that they will not have received it by the time they are seeking to enter the racecourse or licensed premises located in a Regional Area.

9. Essential Personnel (jockeys, trainers, stablehands, Officials and Service Providers) who reside or have been to Queensland on or after 19 June 2021 are permitted to attend the race meeting, provided that they have not been to any of the COVID-19 Exposure Sites listed in the links below or are a close or casual contact of anyone who has been to the exposure sites.

A COVID-19 declaration which can be found on the Racing NSW Website must be completed and provided to Racing NSW Stewards steward@racingnsw.com.au by any person that has been to Queensland on or after 19 June 2021 prior to attending a racecourse or licensed premises. <https://www.racingnsw.com.au/news/covid/important-information/>
